Chapter Two is Neil Simon's hit Broadway play which opened in 1977 and ran for 857 performances. It starred Judd Hirsch as George and Anita Gillette as Jennie.

It was no secret that Simon had based the story on his own life. Simon had lost his wife of 20 years, Joan, to cancer in 1973. Without giving himself time to fully grieve the loss, Simon met and fell in love with actress Marsha Mason later that same year. After knowing each other only three weeks, the two married. Although their professional collaboration during their years together yielded several hit films including The Goodbye Girl (1977), The Cheap Detective (1978) and Only When I Laugh (1981), it became clear early on that there were serious problems in the marriage. Before he could write the play, Simon felt he had to go to Mason to get her consent. "If this was too personal to go public with, despite the fact that I would try to give the characters their own personalities separate from ours, I would still have to adhere to her wishes." When he finally asked her, she said, 'It's fine with me because what you'd be telling is your story, not mine. You'd write about what was going on in your head and could only presume what was happening to me. If I want to tell my story, maybe I'll put it in my own book one day.' Simon was enormously grateful for her consent and encouragement, and although he knew he'd made no promises to her, he would have to treat the story as truthfully as he could.

It never fails to amaze me how much we can do on our tiny stage! It's never easy but somehow we always seem to be able to pull it off.
